CEE collaborated with UNESCO, in Gujarat to launch the SEEDS OF CHANGE: State of Education Report (SoER) for India 2023 on Education to Address Climate Change. This annual flagship publication by the UNESCO New Delhi Regional Office was developed by CEE as a Technical Partner. Notably, its Gujarati summary was launched and shared with the attendees at the event.

The launch featured distinguished speakers, including Shri Kartikeya Sarabhai, Founder & Director, CEE; Dr Chong Shimray, Associate Professor, Dept of Education Science and Mathematics, NCERT and Ms Joyce Poan, Programme Specialist & Chief of Education, UNESCO. Further, a dynamic panel discussion with educators, policymakers, and environmental experts explored concrete actions towards 'Greening Schools and Curricula'. The panel had teachers and principals from some of the leading schools of Ahmedabad.

Shri Mahesh Mehta, Secretary, Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, Government of Gujarat, was part of the panel discussion and he spoke about all the actions that select schools in Gujarat are taking towards greening. He further shared on Saksham Shala, an ongoing initiative in collaboration with UNICEF and CEE that works towards making schools clean, green, safe and inclusive.

The Climate Change Department organised trainings for batches 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10. The Saksham Shala training concluded with the 10th batch along with UNICEF and Samagra Shiksha. Waste Management and MRF session by Prabhjot Sodhi

The Department of Housing and Urban Affairs, Assam organised a 2-day foundation training course for the first batch of 96 Assam Urban Administrative Service Officers on March 8-9, 2024. Mr Prabhjot Sodhi delivered a session on Waste Management and the management & operations of the Material Recovery Facility (MRF). The session witnessed participation from 96 Officers and the Urban Management Centre (UMC) team. CEE team member Mr Amit Kumar also delivered a session on Wet Waste Management. The officers then visited for an exposure visit to the HDFC Bank, CEE & SWMS MRF in Guwahati to witness and understand the entire system of operations at the MRF. During the exposure visit, the CEE and SWMS team explained the entire system and also demonstrated water conservation measures used at the MRF. The MRF operations were highly appreciated by the officers, especially emphasising aspects like water conservation, Health Safety and Hygiene, and efficient and transparent system and planning at the MRF.



Two-day training on ESD by CEE East

On February 20-21, 2024, CEE East held a 2-day training for the Child in Need Institute (CINI) on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), Waste Management, and Climate Change with a focus on gender impact. The event aimed to integrate these themes as cross-cutting issues in CINI's projects. Senior teams from CINI's Health, Child Protection, and Nutrition departments across West Bengal, Assam, Odisha, and Jharkhand benefited from the programme. Ms Preeti Rawat from CEE North led the online session on ESD. The training also included a planning exercise for CINI staff, focusing on practical application in existing projects.

On March 20, 2024, an exciting employee engagement workshop was conducted by CEE DO for a group of young corporate professionals from a leading Multinational Corporation (MNC). They also prepared learning materials based on the trail to be distributed in schools. The workshop encouraged hands-on involvement in addressing environmental challenges while simultaneously contributing to social welfare.

Over 200 women attended the event. 20 Self-Help Group (SHG) members were felicitated with awards under different categories like best SHG, best entrepreneur, best leader, etc. The members had more than four stalls at the venue and achieved sales worth INR 8,000.

International Day of Zero Waste by School Group

On March 30, 2024, the school group celebrated the International Day of Zero Waste, where they hosted both in-person and online workshops dedicated to fostering a culture of sustainability and waste reduction. The inperson workshop focused on practical techniques like waste segregation, composting, and creating your own kitchen garden, empowering participants to take tangible steps towards a greener lifestyle.

Meanwhile, the online webinar saw enthusiastic participation from schools and colleges nationwide. Expert speakers like Krithika Viswanathan, Lead - Business Development at Saahas Zero Waste, and Dr Vishal Jain, Associate Professor at Geetanjali Institute of Technical Studies, Udaipur, shared invaluable insights on the Zero Waste Lifestyle and the Zero Waste Institute.



Workshop on Nurturing Sustainable Rural Development and Climate Action in the Rural Economy

On March 21, Rural Programme Group (RPG) organised a stakeholder consultation workshop on "Nurturing Sustainable Rural Development and Climate Action in the Rural Economy". The workshop was attended by various stakeholders, including 40 participants from the Agriculture Department, Horticulture Department, GOPKA, GUJPRO (Government of Gujarat), AKRSP, private consultants specialising in Natural and Organic Farming, and NGOs.

During the workshop, detailed discussions were held on the findings and challenges outlined in the COMREC study focusing on Gujarat, Maharashtra, and Bihar regions. Strategies for promoting honey and fishery, utilising portable soil and water analysis kits, exploring various schemes offered by NABARD for promoting harvesting techniques, establishing market linkages, carbon credits, and advancing organic and natural farming practices were also discussed.

Mr Kartikeya Sarabhai also provided valuable insights on the interconnectedness of sustainable development across various sectors and emphasised the importance of agricultural education and addressing climate change at different levels.





Organic Farming Practices for Climate Resilient Agriculture and Eco-activities by RPG

A total of 50 BMC members actively participated and appreciated CEE's efforts in strengthening BMC and PBR. The training included documentary showcases, engaging 'Biodiversity Around You' activities, and discussions on the structure and importance of PBR at the village level. Teams from both CEE Central and CEE North also participated in this training session.

Workshop on Sustainable Horizons: A Comprehensive Workshop on Climate Change, its Impacts, and Adaptation Strategies

RPG organised a Sustainable Horizons: A Comprehensive Workshop on Climate Change, Its Impacts, and Adaptation/Mitigation Strategies within the Gujarat Context" for master trainers of Hariraj Charitable Trust. The participants were enlightened by Mr Suman Rathod, Dr Dhara Rajput and Mr Raman Patel on the the basics of climate change, its impact on livelihood and agriculture and water and mitigation for it. The group also visited the lush green CEE campus, a nature trail conducted Sagar Sheikh.



Special Session on Road Safety at The Planet Discovery Centre

After the week-long campaign, the team will analyse the challans and make an action plan for making roads safer for all.

The team discussed the roles, responsibilities, gaps, and challenges inherent in CSR and NGO initiatives. Interactive Session by CEE and the Bhutan Royal Academy for Bhutan Schools



An interactive session brought together 540 students along with teachers from the schools of Bhutan, facilitated by the Bhutan Royal Academy and CEE, as part of the UNEP's Tide Turners Plastic Challenge. The session served as a platform to educate and empower youth about the pressing issue of single-use plastics in Bhutan. Through engaging discussions and activities, CEE shed light on the environmental impacts of such plastics and inspired these young minds to take collective action for a cleaner and greener future.

Campaign on Drive Against Plastic Pollution by CEE Delhi

CEE's state partner One Earth Foundation spearheaded a unique campaign "Drive Against Plastic Pollution" in Goa to spotlight the pressing issue of marine plastic pollution and its impact on Goa's coastlines and marine biodiversity.

As a part of the campaign spanning over 30 days, the team sailed 120 km across the entire coast of Goa conducting over 50 activities around the circular economy, waste reduction, and plastic pollution. Workshops were organised on plastic waste, fostering sustainable consumption habits, and promoting the concept of 5Rs (Rethink, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Recover). Over the 30 days, 59 educational and awareness workshops were conducted sensitizing more than 1,500 students and youth and five fishing communities across Goa, and collecting about 1,146 kg of waste from the beach and mangrove clean-up.



National Conference on Jal Jeevan Mission and Swachh Bharat Mission

The Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti organised a National Conference on Jal Jeevan Mission and Swachh Bharat Mission-Grameen on February 16-17, 2024 in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. The conference focused on key themes of innovation, collaboration, sustainability, and O&M; participation from diverse stakeholders from various states/UTs of India had a rich exchange of ideas and best practices. The session on Plastic Waste Management was chaired by Shri Arvind Kumar Chaudhary (PS, RDD, Bihar), co-chaired by Dr Sharmila Mary Joseph, IAS Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Dept. Kerala and moderated by Mr Prabhjot Sodhi. Shri Kapil Chaudhary, Director, SBMG, DDWS set the context for the panel discussion and shared the progress at the National Level. The panelists for the session were Shri O P Srivastava- Chief Engineer, Ministry of Road, Transport and Highways (MoRTH).

Shri A Kuttalingam- Chief Engineer, RD&PRD, Tamil Nadu, PMGSY Road, Shri Santhosha G R, IFS & MD SBMG West Bengal, and Shri Ashish Tiwari, Secretary, Dept of Environment, Forest & Climate Change at Govt of UP. The panelists discussed policies and regulations, economic incentives, current practices, and challenges in the implementation of plastics; how bituminous road construction to happen and also presented their best practices, achievements, and innovative and replicable ideas from their respective states. The Chair also invited voices from the field to share their experiences.



Awareness Session on Plastic Waste Management in Government Schools

Under the HDFC Bank, CEE & NEEDS project, 'Rural & Urban Landscape Free of Dry & Plastic Waste' in Ranchi, a school awareness session was organised for the students of Class 6 to 8 at the Government Middle School of Baridih Panchayat. The session focussed on Plastic Waste Management with discussions on the harmful effects of plastic littering and the consequences of burning plastic. The students were motivated by the dry & plastic waste collection and segregation process at their school and home. They were encouraged to use the dustbins and reduce their consumption of plastic to make their school and home plastic-free. Around 62 Students participated in the awareness session.

Awareness Session on Segregation and Responsible Management of Waste in Ganjam

Under the HDFC Bank, CEE & CORE project 'Rural & Urban Landscape Free of Dry & Plastic Waste' in Odisha, an awareness session on the importance of source segregation and responsible management of waste in Ramagada Panchayat, Ganjam was organised. A total of 73 participants, including Sarpanch, PRI members, Anganwadi workers, Asha didi, SHG members, sanitation workers of villages, and villagers, participated in the session. They were oriented and encouraged to practice these principles in their daily lives. Additionally, to emphasise the importance of the conservation of water, the team demonstrated handwashing with minimal water consumption using Sato Tap to maintain hygiene.







Door-to-Door Awareness Campaign in Ranchi

Under the HDFC Bank, CEE & NEEDS project 'Rural & Urban Landscape Free of Dry & Plastic Waste' in Ranchi, a campaign "Mera Plastic Meri Zimmedari" was organised in Dahu village. It included door-to-door awareness about dry & plastic waste collection and segregation processes at households to make their village Swachh and Sundar. The team encouraged 50 households to collect their waste in a sack at their homes.
